Summer Sports Programs





Athletics is arguably Whanganui Collegiate Schools most successful sport with its beginnings recorded as early as November 1867. A small school of 445 students, our Athletics team boasts a record at National level that any school in New Zealand would be proud of. At the New Zealand Secondary Schools Championships in December 2019, under the guidance of Mr Alec McNab, we had the best Secondary Schools Athletics team in terms of medals at the Championships. Over many decades the school has performed with distinction in major Championships with many past and present athletes gaining international representation



Whanganui Collegiate School has a long and successful history of secondary schools' cricket in New Zealand, with many of our 1st XI fixtures that are well over 100 years old and rich in tradition and history. All teams compete in local competitions and inter schools' fixtures throughout the North Island. The cricket program has produced numerous first-class cricketers, most recently Black Cap, Tom Bruce.

Wonderful facilities, a well-structured cricket program, underpinned by high quality coaches, a sound Academy Programme and one of the best annual fixture lists sees a most complete secondary schools cricket program.



As the most successful school in the history of the prestigious Maadi Cup Regatta, rowing is an iconic sport at Whanganui Collegiate School and carries a successful and proud tradition for both boys and girls. The club has won the Maadi Cup seventeen times which remains a national record. The girls also have an extremely successful record at the Championships, having won the Levin Cup. Coaches and athletes work together to ensure that the School's reputation is maintained as one of the top co-educational rowing schools in New Zealand. Opportunities exist to enter both the NZ Rowing representative pathway, and the NZ/USA/ GB University programmes.

Summer Sports Programs





WCS Sailing Club is well resourced housing several social and competitive graded boats at the Lake Pauri. This wonderful venue which is only 10 minutes from our School is arguably our best kept secret with a good resource of boats on offer and an excellent venue to both learn the art of sailing and develop and improve sailing skills. With a limited capacity of sailors, the club participates in numerous regattas locally as well as across the North Island.

A small but enthusiastic group of sailors regularly train and compete in these regattas with varying success.



Swimming as a summer sport at WCS offers opportunity for a dedicated number of swimmers under the guidance of our school coaches to train and compete in local, regional and national meets. Our structured programme runs out of our onsite swimming pool as well as the local Splash Centre facility and is divided into a 3-squad system.

Our programme aligns with local Whanganui Swimming to maximise all training opportunities with many of our swimmers competing regularly in regional and national events as well as events such as open water swims and the River Swim.



Tennis as a sport provides an opportunity for talented players to excel and has a sustainable structure. It develops physical capacities that can carry over to other sports codes and follows the well-established program of progression and development.

Whanganui Collegiate School Tennis, with over 120 students playing the game, operates in a squad system where students are promoted into the squad that best suits their abilities and age group. Each squad has two one-hour practices per week with a professional coach within their squad as well as being required to play one singles match and one doubles match per week, with the results linking to the national points system and their school ranking.

Summer Sports Programs





Rugby 7s is relatively new to the WCS sports program with a small squad of selected players at senior secondary school level representing WCS at several local, regional and national tournaments through the summer terms.

The last seasons has seen this squad perform well, proceeding through local competitions and attend the National Condors 7's tournament, held in Auckland each December. Several of our players have seen selection to national 7s teams.



WCS has a structured sports coaching and mentoring program, complemented by a high quality Strength and Conditioning facility in the Izard Sports Centre. This area offers all students the opportunity to work on their strength, conditioning, and fitness specific to their sport or for their wellbeing. A wonderful gym supervised by a the very experienced S&C coach, Mr Gilman Barnitt. We have an on-site physiotherapist and Biokineticist who look after all our sporting injuries and this makes the WCS sport and wellbeing offering one of the most complete about.



Our School Sports Programme is underpinned by a strong inter House Sports competition each year. This highly competitive inter House competition sees the girls join their affiliated boys Houses and compete throughout the year for the various sports shields. Regular competitions in the summer months include inter House, tennis, junior and senior House cricket, rowing, athletics, and swimming.

Winter Sports Programs





Badminton at Whanganui Collegiate caters for players of varying ability. Our students train three times a week at the local badminton club in the Izard Indoor Sport complex onsite at Whanganui Collegiate School.

Local inter-schools' competitions are few but a large majority play in a competitive internal competition. In Term 3 several take the opportunity to play in an inter schools' competition held each Friday afternoon at a local neighbouring school. Some of our more skilled players play in the local men's and women's inter-club competition over the weekends as well as representing our region in age group squads.



Basketball remains a very important second choice option for many of our students. It has shown strong growth in the last seasons due to an enjoyable local Friday evening competition in the local Springvale Sports Complex, a short walk from our campus.

Each year we enter around 6-8 teams, ranging from boys' and girls' junior teams to the boys' and girls' senior divisions, all competing in the Friday evening competition




Whanganui Collegiate School has a very strong tradition in Cross Country and frequently features in the medals at the New Zealand Secondary Schools Championship and many of our runners go on to be selected to national teams at age group level. Most recently both the boys' and girls' national cross country team captains have been selected form our ranks and testament to the level of coaching and dedication of our group of cross-country athletes.

Our runners continue to perform nationally and often underpin NZSS Cross Country teams that travel and represent our country at World Schools events.

Winter Sports Programs





The earliest records of Football matches being played at WCS appear in the mid 1890's but it was not until 1974 that football became an official winter sport at WCS and has seen steady growth to the extent that we now regularly field six teams each season. With limited age group competitions locally, the boy's 1st XI and girl's 1st XI compete in the Manawatu secondary school's competition.

Our Colts teams, boy's 2nd XI and girl's 2nd XI compete in the local age group Whanganui competitions. Several of our teams play in regular inter schools' fixtures which completes a comprehensive fixture list for all teams.



Hockey at WCS is one of our largest sports with boys and girls achieving at the highest levels. Our Girls and Boys 1st XI teams compete in the Manawatu Schools' Division One competition, as well as numerous Inter-School fixtures in the lower North Island, and at the Federation Cup and Founders Cup winter hockey tournaments. Our girl's 2nd XI, boy's 2nd XI and boy's 3rd XI compete in the Manawatu Schools league whilst other teams that all play in the local Whanganui competitions.

Our Colts teams are fortunate enough to play in several Inter-School fixtures throughout the season which ensures a good competitive fixture list for these developing players.



A new era in the Whanganui Collegiate School's history and sporting history began in 1991, when the first group of girls entered as students. From the 46 girls new to WCS, two netball teams were selected and entered into the local competition, playing each Saturday during the season as well as in inter-school games beyond Whanganui. This was the start of what was to become the biggest girls sport offered at WCS.

The traditional fixture list has not changed much over the last 25 years or so with teams participating in several interschool fixtures held in the winter as well as playing in local competition netball held on Saturday afternoons, whilst our Senior A team compete in the Senior Women's Premier competition.

Winter Sports Programs





Rugby has been played at WCS since 1882 and arguably our most popular sport. Many current 1st XV traditional fixtures date back well over a hundred years, including the oldest Quadrangular tournament in the country. This tournament is played annually between WCS, Christ's College, Wellington College and Nelson College.

The 1st XV plays a number of traditional fixtures, Inter-School fixtures and competes in the Central North Island 1st XV Competition, established in 2012, and now considered one of the prominent secondary schools' competitions in New Zealand. Our U14, U15, and 2nd XV teams play in the Manawatu competition, with the U15 and 2nd XV competing in a number of Inter-School fixtures as well.



The highlight for many is the House Winter Sports Festival that takes at the end of Term 3 each year. This two-week festival of inter-house sports competition sees all winter codes competed for including, boys and girls senior and junior House hockey, boys junior and senior House football, Girls football, junior and senior House rugby, basketball and badminton.

The highlight being the Indoor Athletics meeting. At the end of this competitive and gruelling two-week festival one of the Houses is crowned winner and presented the coveted House Winter Sports Festival Shield.


These supporters clubs raise the level of offer in all sports and fill an important role. We would encourage all parents to consider getting involved.







WCS expanded its rugby fixture list to include Kings College of Auckland, New Plymouth Boys High School and Palmerston North Boys High School






Nelson College joined to form the current rugby Quadrangular tournament




